## Land Acknowledgement



**Practicum Introduction** 

## **FIRE-Practicum and Seminar**

The purpose of the practicum is to provide students with opportunities to develop, integrate, and reinforce social work competence through supervised practice.

The practicum promotes integration of the theory and skills students learn in the classroom with their professional practice and social work identity.

Regular, on-going supervision is critical in supporting the learning, skill development and professional growth of students in practicum.



FIRE: Fall 2024 & Winter 2025 Field Practicum, Integrative Seminar, Research Applications & Exit Requirement

#### SOWK 660 Advanced Practicum

- 3 days per week (Mondays, Tuesdays, & Wednesdays)
- 500 hour minimum practicum over fall 2024 and winter 2025
- Practicum Coordination D2L site available
- IPT process no proposal required
- Proposal deadline for 'student-initiated search' (including workplace practicum) and 'self-directed': June 19

#### SOWK 662 Integrative Seminar

- Course scheduled for Friday afternoons focus on practice process and content
- All (graded) assignments build towards helping you develop and articulate your sense of integration across all areas of social work
- You will work on this integration throughout the Integrative Seminar Course, culminating in a capstone assignment
