


We are grateful to the Indigenous peoples of these lands for the privilege of working, learning, and living on these lands.


MSW Specialization: International and Community Development



International and Community Development: International Social Development

- Social work lens to examine and engage with policies, practices and ethical approaches to working with diverse populations in global and local contexts.
- Analyze the social forces, structures, systems and international institutions that give rise to different models of social development.
- Explore and build skills to apply alternative intervention strategies and methods.
- Sustainable development issues, gender-based violence, conflict, displacement, debt, disasters, and global Indigenous movements, are among the topics to be explored, from community development to project design and policy analysis.

Amy Fulton **Practicum Introduction**

Practicum

The purpose of the practicum is to provide students with opportunities to develop, integrate, and reinforce social work competence through supervised practice.

The practicum promotes integration of the theory and skills students learn in the classroom with their professional practice and social work identity.

Regular, on-going supervision is critical in supporting the learning, skill development and professional growth of students in practicum.





FIRE: Fall 2024 & Winter 2025 Field Practicum, Integrative Seminar, Research Applications & Exit Requirement Virtual Residency April 4-5, 2025

SOWK 660 – Clinical Practicum

- 3 5 days per week (minimum 20 maximum 40 hours per week)
- 500 hour-practicum in Fall 2024 and Winter 2025

SOWK 662: Integrative Seminar

- Focus on process and content
- All (graded) assignments build towards helping you develop and articulate your sense of integration across all areas of social work
- Integration and the exit requirement will be worked on throughout the Integrative Seminar Course

Role of Field Education Coordinator

Coordinators of Field Education:

- Work cooperatively with agencies; assess for affiliation as a field placement;
- Provide consultation to students, field instructors, and faculty;
- Coordinate the field instructor approval process;
- Plan and implement the process for students' selection into field placements;
- Plan educational events for field instructors.



Field Instructor Requirements

Social worker approval as field instructor

- MSW degree & RSW (in provinces where required by law)
- Provide 1 hour of supervision for every 15 hours in practicum (approximately 1-2 hours per week)
- Can have co-field instructors (maximum of 2 field instructors per placement)



Practicum in the Place of Employment

- Requires clear separation between employee and student role
 - Different agency area or program
 - Field instructor usually different from regular supervisor
 - Focus needs to be on new learning
 - Exception is a new job starting no earlier than May 1, 2024 that also meets practicum criteria
- Approval process:
 - Detailed practicum proposal including learning objectives, signed by your practicum supervisor, yourself and the workplace supervisor

Proposal Deadline: May 2024



External Co-Supervision

- Students may have an opportunity to work with more than one field instructor (also known as practicum supervisor)
- Students may be assigned an on-site instructor and be paired with an external field instructor who works outside of the agency.
- The external field instructor is located off-site (outside the agency or organization), and holds a MSW credential (as well as RSW in provinces where required).
- The external field instructor provides educational supervision from a social work perspective, supporting students in integrating theory and practice, critically reflecting on their practicum and practice, and developing as a professional. They provide feedback on the creation of the learning agreement and participate in evaluation meetings. They do not directly observe the students in practice, or assign students roles or tasks in the agency.
- May be provided virtually/remotely

Intern Placement Tracker (IPT)

- Online database (www.runiptca.com)
- Allows students, field instructors, faculty liaisons and field education coordinators to complete tasks:
 - Keeping relevant practicum and contact information upto-date
 - Completing forms online i.e. learning agreement, timesheets, etc.
 - ICD has its own IPT database. Everyone will receive new log-in information in fall 2023.


Once practicum begins, your Faculty Liaison becomes your primary contact at the University (Fall 2024)
