


## **Embarking on your Graduate Certificate Journey**





- The Trauma-Informed Practice certificate consists of 4 courses, SOWK 611, 613, 615, and 617, that will explore core elements of social work knowledge and practice.
- This topic area prepares practitioners to recognize the impacts of trauma in various contexts and provide appropriate social work interventions and supports. A critical trauma informed lens is central to professional social work practice as most persons encounter traumatic experiences at some point in the lives of individuals, families, and communities.
- Critical components of professional practice include vicarious traumatization and secondary traumatic stress, thus a central constituent of this topic area is relevant content and activities in self-awareness and self-care.









- 4 courses over 8 months
  - 2 courses in Fall term
  - 2 courses in Winter term
  - Courses run sequentially
  - Must pass each course to move to the next course
- Blended learning
  - Synchronous and asynchronous learning
  - Virtual and in-person residencies
  - Scheduled class times: Tuesdays & Thursdays,6PM 8PM
